The papers of Lilly Trog-Prinz, analysand of psychoanalyst K. R. Eissler, were given to the Library of Congress by Trog-Prinz in 1991. Her son, Alexander R. Torok, gave additional material in 1996.

The papers of Lilly Trog-Prinz were arranged and described in 1992. Letters from K. R. Eissler to Trog-Prinz received by the Library in 1996 were added to the collection in 2001.

1925	First marriage (divorced 1939)
1927	Psychoanalyzed daily for six months by Eduard Hitschmann in Vienna, Austria
1928	Awarded certificate in piano (Staatsprüfung in Klavier), Vienna, Austria Birth of son Alexander R. Torok ("Axel")
1936	Moved to join husband in Alexandria, Egypt
1940	Second marriage (divorced 1949)
1942	Worked in tuberculosis ward of military hospital in Alexandria, Egypt, and eventually caught the disease
1949	Married Alfred Trog
1957	Alfred Trog committed suicide Became psychoanalytic patient of K. R. Eissler
1961	Met a new companion following the death of her third husband with whom she divided her time between Florence, Italy, and Vienna, Austria; the companion died in 1971
1983	Moved to be near son in Lake Jackson, Tex.
1992, Dec.	Died, Lake Jackson, Tex.

Scope and Content Note

The papers of Lilly Trog-Prinz (1908-1992) span the years 1957-1992 and consist largely of letters written to Trog-Prinz by her psychoanalyst, K. R. Eissler. The letters, almost exclusively in German, were written mainly from Eissler's New York office and were addressed to Trog-Prinz in Florence, Italy; Vienna, Austria; and Lake Jackson, Texas. The collection also includes two autobiographical narratives written by Trog-Prinz in 1991.
