## Scope and Content Note

The papers of Edwin Arlington Robinson (1869-1935) span the years 1913-1940 and consist of correspondence and holograph poems, including "Amaranth," "Lancelot and Guinevere," "The Master," "Old King Cole," "Talifer," and "Tristram." Many of the poems represented here appeared in Robinson's *Man Against the Sky: A Book of Poems* (1916). Also included are nine letters by Robinson, 1924-1932, and one letter about him. The collection was originally assembled by Robinson's fellow poet and friend Louis Ledoux.
