The papers of Louise Imogen Guiney, poet, essayist, journalist, and librarian, were given anonymously by F. Holland Day to the Library of Congress via Julius H. Tuttle of the Massachusetts Historical Society in 1934. Additional material was purchased in 1978.

Biographical Note

Louise Imogen Guiney was born in Roxbury, Massachusetts, in 1861, the daughter of General Patrick R. Guiney, an Irish-born American Civil War officer and lawyer. She was educated at Elmhurst Convent school in Providence, Rhode Island, and worked as a postmistress in Auburndale, Mass., and cataloger at the Boston Public Library. In 1884, she published her first book of poems, *Songs at the Start*, followed in the 1890s by collections of poems and essays entitled *A Roadside Harp* and *Patrins*. She edited editions of James Clarence Mangan and of Matthew Arnold, and shared with Harriet Elizabeth Prescott Spofford and Alice Brown the authorship of *Three Heroines of English Romance*. She moved to England in 1901 and died at Gloucestershire on November 2, 1920.

Scope and Content Note

The papers of Louise I. Guiney (1861-1920) span the years 1884-1920 and consist chiefly of letters from Guiney to her friend F. Holland Day, a photographer and publisher of her work. Also included are poems, transcripts of her letters to Louise Chandler Moulton, and correspondence to Guiney from H. de K. G. (Helena de Kay Gilder), Alice Brown, Lewis Foreman Day, Frederick H. Evans, Annie Fields, Edmund Gosse, Lionel Pigot Johnson, Alice M. Jordan, F. Eva Lewis, Robert Loveman, Annie Nathan Meyer, Louise Chandler Moulton, Albert Bigelow Paine, Horace Elisha Scudder, Clement King Shorter, Dora Sigerson Shorter, John Brisben Walker, and Louise Collier Willcox.
