Also includes correspondence, notes, and notebooks from later in his career.

## **Scope and Content Note**

The papers of Worthington C. Ford (1858-1941) span the years circa 1900-1926, with the bulk of the material concentrated in the period 1901-1909 while Ford was chief of the Manuscript Division of the Library of Congress. Included is an untitled book draft by Ford on European and American history, indexes of historical papers, including of Thomas Jefferson and Alexander Hamilton, and notes on China, Cuba, Netherlands East Indies, France, Germany, Greece, Russia, and other countries and topics. Also included are notes, research notebooks and correspondence from later in his career.
