Scope and Content Note

The papers of John Philip Frey (1871-1957) span the years 1891-1951. The collection consists of correspondence, diary, articles, speeches, memoranda, notebooks, research notes, financial data, labor agreements, legal briefs, minutes, reports, pamphlets, periodicals, clippings, posters, and photographs. Included is a name and subject index to the *International Molders Journal* for the period of Frey's editorship, 1908-1927, and scrapbooks of clippings dealing with his activities in the American Federation of Labor.
