**Summary:** Army officer, surgeon, and diplomat. Correspondence, diaries, speeches, military papers, subject files, biographical data, scrapbooks, newspaper clippings, maps, photographs, and other papers relating primarily to Wood's career in the United States Army, including his participation in the Apache Wars, especially the campaign to capture Geronimo. Also documents Wood's service as military governor of Cuba, and later, of Moro Province, Philippines.

## Acquisition Information

The papers of Leonard Wood were deposited in the Library of Congress by his wife, Louise Adriana Wood, between 1932 and 1943 and were converted to a gift in 1975. Other gifts and purchases were added from 1929 to 1978.

## Processing History

The collection was organized prior to 1960 and expanded in 1983. The finding aid was revised in 2012. Katherine Duvall converted the finding aid to EAD in 2022.

Photographs in containers 316, 328, 330-332, 334, and 340 were withdrawn from the collection in 1953 by Wood's daughter, Louise B. Wood, and are no longer available. Containers 239-282, 284, and 287 were removed from the collection in 1987 after microfilming and are now only available on microfilm.

## Copyright Status

Copyright in the unpublished writings of Leonard Wood Papers in these papers and in other collections of papers in the custody of the Library of Congress has been dedicated to the public.

## Access and Restrictions

The papers of Leonard Wood are open to research. Many collections are stored off-site and advance notice is needed to retrieve these items for research use. Researchers are advised to contact the Manuscript Reading Room prior to visiting.

## Microfilm

A microfilm edition of part of these papers is available on 25 reels. Consult reference staff in the Manuscript Division concerning availability for purchase and interlibrary loan. *To promote preservation of the originals, researchers are required to consult the microfilm edition.*

## Scope and Content Note

The papers of Leonard Wood (1860-1927) span the years 1825-1942 and consist of correspondence, diaries, speeches, military papers, subject files, biographical data, scrapbooks, newspaper clippings, maps, photographs, and other papers relating to Wood’s career in the United States Army including his participation in the Apache Wars and the campaign to capture Geronimo. Also documents Wood’s service as military governor of Cuba, and later, of Moro Province, Philippines. Included are papers of his wife, Louisa Adriana Wood, and other family papers, and biographical files gathered by Hermann Hagedorn for *Leonard Wood: A Biography* (1931) and by Lawrence F. Abbott. The collection is organized into nine series: [Diaries](#), [General Correspondence](#), [Cablegrams Sent](#), [Personal Correspondence](#), [Family Papers](#), [Letters of Condolence](#), [Subject File](#), [Biographers’ Papers](#), and [Addition](#).
