**Summary:** William H. Tunner, United States Air Force officer, and Margaret Ann Hamilton Tunner, World War II Women Airforce Service Pilots (WASP) pilot. Correspondence, reports, military records, biographical materials, writings, photographs, and photograph albums relating primarily to William H. Tunner's career in the United States Air Force. Correspondence, military records, biographical materials, photographs, and scrapbooks concerning Margaret Ann Hamilton Tunner's private life as well as her service as a WASP during World War II and her work in Japan for the occupation forces after the war.

## Acquisition Information

Part I of the William H. Tunner and Margaret Ann Hamilton Tunner Papers was given to the Library of Congress by William S. Tunner in 2021. Parts II and III were given by H. Suzanne Tunner Hudson in 2021.

## Processing History

The papers of William H. Tunner and Margaret Ann Hamilton Tunner were arranged and described by Emilia Schrier with the assistance of Tracey Barton, Sara Ludewig, and Shandra Morehouse in 2022. Part I of the collection had been arranged by the Office of Air Force History in 1980. Elements of this prior arrangement were retained during processing. The Office of Air Force History microfilmed the materials in Part I in 1980. This microfilm constitutes Part III. Some papers in Part I have undergone mold remediation and cleaning. The exterior covers of some scrapbooks in Part II have been removed because of mold, but the original order of the contents has been retained.

## Transfers

Films and a sound recording have been transferred to the Motion Picture, Broadcasting, and Recorded Sound Division where they are identified as part of the William H. Tunner and Margaret Ann Hamilton Tunner Papers. Patrons are encouraged to contact the Motion Picture, Broadcasting, and Recorded Sound Division in advance of a research visit.

## **Scope and Content Note**

The papers of William H. Tunner (1906-1983) and Margaret Ann Hamilton Tunner (1917-2009) span the years 1900-2006, with the bulk of the material dating from 1940 to 1980. This material documents William H. Tunner's military career in the United States Armed Forces and post-retirement career as a consultant on airlift and air transport, as well as Margaret Ann Hamilton Tunner's service during World War II in the Women Airforce Service Pilots (WASP) and service after the war for the occupation forces in Japan. The papers are primarily in English, with some Japanese and German. The collection is organized into three parts.

Part I documents William H. Tunner's career in the United States Air Force and his key role in the development of airlift and air transport. The papers comprehensively cover his military commands from the 1940s onward, including the India-China Division, responsible for the Hump airlift, the Berlin Airlift, Combat Cargo Command, responsible for the Korean Airlift, and eventually the Military Air Transport Service (MATS). These materials also contain correspondence, invitations, and club affiliations that illustrate the social aspects and relationships inherent in Tunner's professional life. William H. Tunner's personal life is represented in materials in Part II. In 1980, the Office of Air Force History microfilmed the files in Part I along with some additional materials not donated to the Library of Congress; copies of these microfilm reels comprise Part III of the collection. Part I is arranged into five series: [Correspondence](#), [Military Commands and Assignments](#), [Personal Papers](#), [Subject File](#), and [Oversize](#).

Part II documents Margaret Ann Hamilton Tunner's service as a member of the Women Airforce Service Pilots during World War II, her work for the Army Occupational Forces in Japan in the late 1940s, and her social responsibilities as the wife of a United States Air Force general. Part II also contains additional material relating to William H. Tunner's military career and covers his post-retirement consulting and writing. Extensive correspondence, photographs, and scrapbooks illustrate the private lives of both individuals. Part II is arranged into five series: [Joint Papers](#), [Margaret Ann Hamilton Tunner](#), [William H. Tunner](#), [National Security Classified Information](#), and [Oversize](#).

Part III contains only one series, the [Microfilm](#) mentioned previously.

The collection's series are listed and briefly described below. A fuller description of each series and a list of its contents can be accessed in the series descriptions within the container list.

### **Part I**

The [Correspondence](#) series contains William H. Tunner's personal correspondence primarily with friends and associates from his military career.

The [Joint Papers](#) series contains materials relating to both William H. Tunner and Margaret Ann Hamilton Tunner and their relationship.

[Margaret Ann Hamilton Tunner's](#) materials document her personal and professional life including her early life in Enid, Oklahoma, military service in the Women Airforce Service Pilots (WASP), civilian service in U.S. occupied Japan, and marriage to William H. Tunner.

[William H. Tunner's](#) papers in Part II contain material relating to his military career that complement the material in Part I, as well as files relating to his post-retirement work as a consultant and writer, and his personal life.

The remaining series in Part II consist of [National Security Classified Information](#) and [Oversize](#) material.

The Military Commands and Assignments series constitutes the majority of Part I and documents Tunner's roles as commanding officer and commanding general across various assignments. The series contains military documents created and maintained during specific airlifts, such as the India-China Division files on the Hump airlift over the Himalayas, and the Korean Airlift; and working files created and maintained during his commands with the Ferrying Division, Air Matériel Command (AMC), and Military Air Transport Service (MATS), among others. Files on the Berlin Airlift Task Force comprise about a third of this series and include a near-complete version of the "History of the Airlift Task Force" report (see [Part III: Microfilm](#) for the complete report). These files also contain a complete run of the *Task Force Times*, a daily newspaper created for and produced by Berlin Airlift pilots that printed the daily transported tonnage of supplies by each unit to encourage competition. Though Tunner was commander in chief of the United States Air Forces in Europe (USAFE) for four years, his files on this command are sparse and contain mostly speech files from the relevant years. **Part II: Margaret Ann Hamilton Tunner, 1900-2006**

Margaret Ann Hamilton Tunner's materials documents her personal and professional life including her early life in Enid, Oklahoma, military service in the Women Airforce Service Pilots (WASP), civilian service in United States occupied Japan, and marriage to William H. Tunner. Margaret Ann Hamilton Tunner kept a steady correspondence with friends and family through much of her life, particularly with her mother, siblings, hometown acquaintances, and close friends from college and the WASP program. These letters shed light on her early life in Oklahoma, her years working and living independently after World War II, and her life with William H. Tunner in Wiesbaden, Germany. These periods of her life are also represented in writings, yearbooks, and many photographs and scrapbooks. Materials from her time in Japan include correspondence to friends and family, records of employment, photographs and slides, and other keepsakes from her travels. Her work during the occupation, however, is minimally documented. An employment file contains some official documentation while the writings and notes files contain some reflections on her work. Her papers on the WASP are not extensive. For related material, researchers should also consult Margaret Ann Hamilton Tunner's military records file in this series and William H. Tunner's WASP material in [Part I: Personal Papers](#) and [Part II: William H. Tunner](#).

William H. Tunner's papers in Part II contain material relating to his military career that complement the materials in Part I, as well as files relating to his post-retirement work as a consultant and writer, and his personal life. The material relating to his military career includes a large group of photographs and additional records from his 201 file and from the various commands documented in [I: Military Commands and Assignments](#). Much of the material relating to the Berlin Airlift in this series relates to anniversaries and commemorations of the airlift. His life outside his military career is documented in the correspondence, which include letters to his parents and siblings during his time at West Point as a young man in the 1920s and his personal and professional correspondence



after his retirement from the military until his death. Tunner's continued work and passion for airlift and air transport after his retirement can be seen in his consulting files and his writings.

Additionally, the microfilm contains supplemental records not included in Part I. This additional material includes portions of Tunner's alphabetical correspondence ("A," "L," and "V files), personal papers, records from his 201 file, material relating to his various commands, additional volumes of the History of the Combined Airlift Task Force, and correspondence, statements, and reports from his interactions with Congress regarding air transport and airlift. An index of the microfilm created by the Office of Air Force History is available as a searchable [PDF](#) and as a paper copy filed in this series.
