Scope and Content Note

The papers of Warren M. Tsuneishi (1921-2011) span the years 1930-2007, with the bulk of the material dating from 1961 to 1999. The collection documents Tsuneishi's career at the Library of Congress as director of Area Studies in the Research Services Department (1978-1989) and chief of the Asian Division, known as the Orientalia Division until 1978 (1966-1978; 1989-1992). The papers are primarily in English, with some Japanese and Chinese. The collection is organized into four series: [Administrative File](#), [China](#), [Japan](#), and [Organizations](#).

The collection documents Tsuneishi's work in building and refining East Asian library collections in the United States, advocating for international library collaboration, and maintaining diplomatic relations between libraries in the United States and in Asia, primarily China and Japan. His papers concern his work to enhance and facilitate the organization of conferences and delegations, standardization of cataloging practices, acquisition and exchange of publications, training programs for librarians, study of translation, and the role of libraries within higher education. The collection includes material pertaining to Tsuneishi's travels on delegations to the National Library of China (1979-1985) as a result of President Richard M. Nixon's rapprochement with the People's Republic of China starting in 1972. It also documents Tsuneishi's editorial contributions to the Japan-U.S. Conference on Libraries and Information Science in Higher Education series (1969-1992), named with the host country of the year preceding the guest, and to the Japanese Literature in Translation Symposium (1979) developed to further the 1960 Treaty of Mutual Cooperation and Security between Japan and the United States. Tsuneishi was quite active in professional service, and the collection documents his contributions to organizations such as the American Council of Learned Societies and the Association for Asian Studies. The collection further chronicles his travels to the First Conference on Asian Library Cooperation in Taiwan (1974), the Library of Congress field office in New Delhi, India (1984), and the Summer Institute on East Asian Librarianship at the University of Washington (1988).
