**Summary:** Librarian of Congress. Personal and professional files of Evans's undergraduate and graduate studies and career as a teacher, director of the Work Projects Administration Historical Records Survey, member of the executive board and advisor to the United States delegation to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), and various positions at the Library of Congress.

## Acquisition Information

The papers of Luther Harris Evans were transferred from the Library of Congress Office of the Librarian to the Manuscript Division as a temporary deposit between 1946 and 1954. An addition was given by Evans in 1981. The deposit was converted to a gift in 2006.

## Custodial History

Between 1962 and 1979, Evans retrieved and returned boxes placed on deposit with the intention of organizing them and to utilize them for research. In some instances, he selected material to be removed from the collection, which were returned to him by the Library.

## Processing History

An initial container list to the collection as received was prepared in 1984 by David Mathisen. The collection was partially arranged and described in 2012 by Cheryl Fox. Remaining unprocessed material was arranged and described and the finding aid revised in 2023 by Nate Scheible. The 2023 processing resulted in a slightly different arrangement than that of the 2012 finding aid. Some items in the Luther Harris Evans Papers have undergone mold remediation.

Other papers of Luther Harris Evans can be found in the Rare Book and Manuscript Library at Columbia University, New York, N.Y., and at the Dolph Briscoe Center for American History at the University of Texas at Austin.

## Scope and Content Note

The papers of Luther Harris Evans span the years 1918-1981, with the bulk of the material dating from 1925 to 1953. The collection documents Evans's personal and professional career as an academic, director of the Historical Records Survey, member of the executive board and advisor to the United States delegation to UNESCO, and in various leadership positions at the Library of Congress. The papers are primarily in English, with some German and Spanish. The collection is organized into four series: [Academic File](#), [Federal Career](#), [Printed Matter](#), and [Oversize](#).

The collection largely adheres to the original arrangement by Evans, based mostly on the trajectory of his academic and professional career. As a result, personal correspondence, biographical material, and non-professional materials are often interfiled chronologically according to the institution or organization he was associated with at a given time.

The collection's series are listed and briefly described below. A fuller description of each series and a list of its contents can be accessed in the series descriptions within the container list.

The Federal Career series documents Evans's involvement in the Work Projects Administration Historical Records Survey (HRS) and UNESCO, and his career at the Library of Congress.

The work of the HRS is documented mostly through correspondence, memoranda, and writings, and frequently deals with personnel issues, planning, and projects, including the American imprints inventory, American portrait survey, and "Annotated Bibliography of American History." The Francis S. Philbrick letter file contains information on early HRS planning. The bulk of the UNESCO files document meetings, beginning with records of the 1945 meetings to establish the organization, and continuing to 1953. Files for each meeting often include Evans's notes on the participants and matters discussed. No material in the collection documents Evans's tenure as UNESCO director-general. The Library of Congress files largely document his role as director of the Legislative Reference Service and contain many notes he maintained throughout his career at the Library, including as librarian, from 1939 to 1953. The "slip notes" contain short memoranda to Evans from secretarial staff regarding phone messages, meetings, reminders, and other day-to-day business. The series also documents Evans's involvement in the drafting and adoption by UNESCO of the 1952 Universal Copyright Convention.
