Biographical Note

Mark Ryan Black was born on April 10, 1945 in Sweetser, Indiana, to Paul L. Black and Carol Baldwin Black. In 1963, he graduated from Oak Hill High School in Grant County, Indiana, where he was an All-State quarterback on the football team. After high school, Black trained as a barber and worked in his father's barbershop in Sweetser.

Black enlisted in the United States Marine Corps on April 29, 1966, and completed recruit training in San Diego. He completed Basic Infantry Training at Camp Pendleton in August 1966 and was assigned to Company D, 1st Battalion, 9th Marines. In November and December 1966 Black's unit conducted training in Okinawa and the Philippines. In January 1967 he participated in Operation Deckhouse V in the Mekong Delta. With 1st Battalion, 9th Marines, Black was later based at Phu Bai and Dong Ha, and took part in Operation Chinook II, Operation Prairie II, Operation Prairie III, and Operation Big Horn II.

In May 1967, Black volunteered to serve in the Combined Action Program (CAP), wherein he served with the Papa 3 unit based near the village of Cam Hieu in Quang Tri Province. During a nighttime attack on his unit's compound on August 14, 1967, Black was killed in action by enemy fire.

Scope and Content

Collection includes audio correspondence, home movie footage, a book, a scrapbook, and digital copies of photographs. The collection consists of audio correspondence recorded by Black during his time in Vietnam in 1966-1967, as well as home movies produced by his family that include images of Black's letters and photographs. Also found in the collection are digital copies of photographs taken by Black during his time in Vietnam as well as from his civilian life before the war, and a scrapbook and book produced by his family that include photocopies of his letters and photographs as well as photocopies of correspondence and other materials related to his death in Vietnam and subsequent memorialization in his hometown of Sweetser, Indiana. Also included are reference copies of audio correspondence and home movie footage.

Arrangement

Collection is arranged in three series: manuscripts, recordings, and computer files. Recordings are arranged by type, and computer files are arranged by storage medium and type.

BOX CD/DVD-9	Audio Correspondence, December 10, 1966-August 10, 1967 Digital content available SR01: 26 audio letters recorded by veteran and sent home to his family during his military service in Vietnam (12/10/1966-8/10/1967). Topics covered include: training in the Philippines; training in Okinawa; serving as his unit's barber; Operation Deckhouse V; living conditions at Phu Bai; feelings of resentment towards rear-echelon support personnel; weather and terrain conditions in Vietnam; summaries of involvement in combat action; Viet Cong tactics; hardships faced in the field; negative opinions of South Vietnamese military personnel; care packages and mail received from home; unreliability of the M-16 rifle; volunteering and training for service in the Combined Action Program; future plans for building a house; casualties suffered among his friends and acquaintances; reflections on Vietnamese society; patrolling and ambush operations; relations with the South Vietnamese Provincial Forces; interactions with local population at Cam Hieu; reading the Bible and attending church services in Vietnam; descriptions of the other Marines in his unit; heavy casualties suffered by companies in 9th Marines; describes defenses and operations at the camp near Cam Hieu; frustration with team leader.
